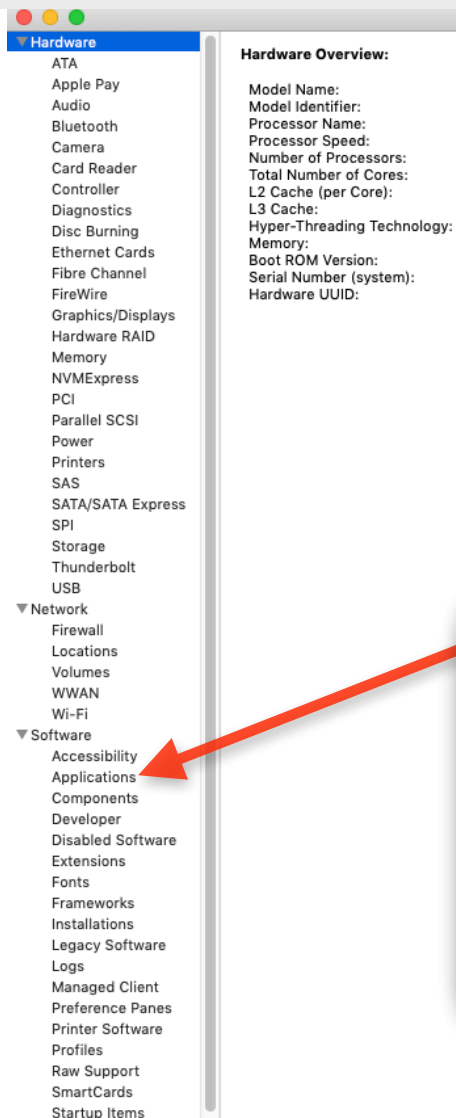


Catalina Prep, determine if there is a problem with using the Applications you have.

Top left of the Mac under the Apple select "about this Mac".



Then select "System Report"



A new window will open up, in that window on the left hand side select Applications. You may have to click on the Arrow next to software to see it.
